- SECURITY Diversion












# **Unplanned explosions**

- Loss of life and injuries
- Large scale destruction
- Population displacement
- Environmental pollution
- Loss of defence capability
- Increase mistrust toward government authorities

### Diversion

- Sparks new, or prolongs conflict
- Delegitimizes peace efforts
- Compromises DDR processes
- Enables violent crime, equips criminal organisations
- Enables terrorist activity
- Undermines legal authority








## Root causes

- Insufficient knowledge about ammunition, its management, and dual risks involved.
- Inadequate resources, planning, and storage infrastructure.
- Absence of national strategies, standards and procedures for ammunition management.









#### Through Life Management

## The solution?

- Surplus and obsolete ammunition disposed of
- Effective and sustainable strategies for the storage, transportation, surveillance, inspection and disposal thoughout the life of the ammunition (old and new)
- Infrastructure, personnel and financial capacities for effective and accountable management
- Development and application of effective national standards






## Geneva International Centre for Humanitarian Demining

The reduction of risk to communities from explosive ordnance by furthering knowledge, promoting norms and standards, developing capacities and facilitating dialogue and cooperation.





## Snapshot of activities: 11 countries in 2020-2021











### What are the International Ammunition Technical Guidelines (IATG)?

#### IATG are a set of guidelines that

- assist States to develop national standards for ammunition management practice and policy.
- ✓ provide a frame of reference from which National Authorities can develop Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) specific to situation and location.
- ✓ are based on existing military regulations







## **Equatorial Guinea**

- 100 people dead and over 600 injured
- destroying over 243 buildings including a hospital



#### Annex C - Sequence of the Explosion Events



An external brush fire started to the northwest of plot B. It reached the commercial explosives storage area (plot B) at approx. 13:00.

The fire from the north-west reached the first containers, causing the explosive materials stored inside to heat up and detonate.

The explosions in Plot B led to explosions in the 3 warehouses in Plot A. The shockwave, intense heat, projection of pieces of containers caused the destruction of the 3 warehouses. This caused the detonation and the ejection of the ammunition

stored inside them.



The ammunition stored in the large metal shed was 105 mm shells and 120 mm mortars. They only burned on site. The projection of a small amount of the ammunition from this area did not go further than 50m from the metal shed.



The final explosions occurred at approx. 13:45.


